Dear Mr. Rivera Berríos:

The Fiscal Year 2025 Commonwealth Budget Resolution (the “FY2025 Budget”) allocates \$15 million to support municipalities to provide social well-being “Ama de Llaves” services subject to the Oversight Board’s review and approval of a distribution plan.

Pursuant to the FY2025 Budget and based on compliance with the applicable requirements, the Oversight Board authorizes the distribution of the aforementioned \$15 million as detailed in **Exhibit A**.

The Oversight Board understands the challenges municipalities face in providing social well-being services, including but not limited to nutrition, hygiene, personal care, home management, and health support, for the eligible population. After discussions with the Office of Management and Budget (“OMB”), the Federation of Mayors, and the Association of Mayors, the Oversight Board requested the Federation and Association to share a survey with their respective members to gather information about “Ama de Llaves” services provided by the municipalities. The Oversight Board reviewed distribution proposals received from the Federation of Mayors and individual municipalities based on this survey.

Based on the applicable criteria and requirements established for the social well-being “Ama de Llaves” program, an allocation was determined for 64 potentially qualified municipalities. The criteria to determine potentially qualified municipalities and allocations takes into consideration population, income variables, and municipal fiscal capacity. To date, 51 of these municipalities have completed the survey and qualified for the fund distribution.

As detailed in **Exhibit B**, the 13 municipalities that have not responded to the survey might also qualify for the disbursement of the determined allocation. The Oversight Board encourages these

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municipalities to complete the survey, and will inform OMB which of these municipalities qualify for the disbursement.

All participating municipalities must comply with the eligibility requirements set forth in the fund agreement they will be signing with the OMB.

We appreciate the Executive Branch's support with this initiative and look forward to continuing our work together for the benefit of Puerto Rico's municipalities.
